Pupil Premium Statement Pearl Hyde Community Primary School

Pupil Premium is additional government funding allocated to schools to boost attainment of disadvantaged children to ensure that all children fulfil his/her potential, regardless of their circumstances.

The funding is allocated to schools for children who have registered for free school meals in the last six years, are in care, or have parents in the Armed Forces. Schools can choose how they wish to spend their money, based on their knowledge of individual pupils needs. However they are responsible and accountable for how they use the additional funding to support pupils from low income families and other target groups.

How much Pupil Premium Funding has Pearl Hyde Community Primary School Received?

- 13/14 Financial Year £48,603 – funding for 51 children
Academic Year available to spend - £55,975
- 14/15 Financial Year £55,566 – funding for 42 children
Academic Year available to spend - £55,513
- 15/16 Financial Year £58,080 – funding for 33 children
Academic Year available to spend to date £23,100 (amount of funding available from 1/4/2016 is not known at present time)

How do we spend Pupil Premium?

Schools are free to choose how to spend their Pupil Premium allocation; however, they are responsible for how they use the additional funding to support children from low-income families and the other target groups. Funds are aimed at helping to bridge the gap; research has shown that some children from disadvantaged backgrounds often do not do as well as others.

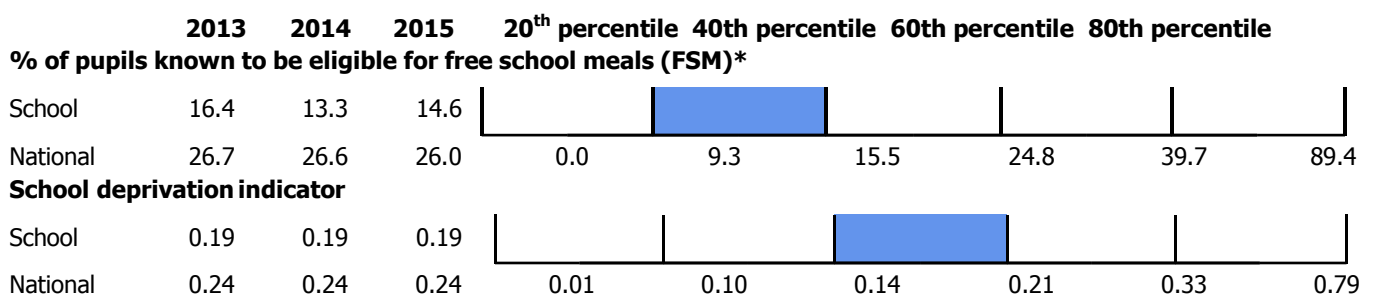
Some children may need help to support them with their academic needs and others may need to be given opportunities to achieve at a higher level, while others may need to build their confidence and self-esteem or support for their emotional well-being. Some children may need help so that they can take part in school trips and activities. There may be times when families experience financial difficulty and need support providing school uniform. Some children need additional support in groups or one to one through interventions.

In line with the Government Pupil Premium policy we have set up systems which enable us to track and monitor the interventions and support given to our Pupil Premium children. The funding enables us to provide intervention and support where it is needed for disadvantaged children in our school. As part of this scheme we have not only been looking at the academic needs of the children but also the wider needs. Therefore this money is allocated to initiatives to ensure all children reach their full potential, both academically and socially.

Planned Spending for Pupil Premium Funding 2015 / 2016:

I day non-contact release time per week for the Inclusion Leader	Continue to develop effective leadership of interventions through the Provision Management System Monitoring and evaluation of intervention programmes
Development of the role of the Learning Mentor position	To support pupils' self-esteem, sense of well-being, enjoyment of school To provide on-going support for families to include CAF, Family Support Meetings, liaising with EWO, CAFco and other relevant agencies
Development of the role of the EWO	To support families who have barriers which prevent them bringing their child/children to school – increase the attendance of persistent absentees
Life enriching activities eg Dol-Y-Moch, PAS experiences, offsite visits	To ensure that all children have equal opportunity to access a range of educational and life enhancing experiences regardless of their family financial circumstances
1:1 / Small group Tuition	Provide interventions for children vulnerable to underachievement, as demonstrated by in-year data, to accelerate their progress and narrow any identified gaps
Staff development	Provide opportunities for staff (teachers & support staff) to develop further skills to enable all children to make the most possible progress e.g. effective marking and feedback, delivery of specific interventions to support lower attaining children, effective differentiation to meet the needs of all children
Personalised Learning Interventions for all groups of children as needs are identified	

If your child is in EYFS, Y1 or Y2 your child is eligible for the Universal Free School Meal. If your child is in KS2 you may be eligible for a free school meal because of your family's income level, please contact Mrs. Wilby in the school office to register for either of these categories.

Even if you do not wish your child to have the meals, this would mean the school could still claim Pupil Premium funding that may be used to help your child. Please be reassured that all enquiries are dealt with in the strictest of confidence.
